The Indiana Insurance Code (Section 27-7-5-2), requires an insurer to provide bodily injury Uninsured Motorist Coverage and Underinsured Motorists Coverage equal to the limit for Liability Coverage in the policy and Uninsured Motorist Property Damage Coverage at the basic Financial Responsibility limit. You may reject the Uninsured Motorist Coverage in its entirety or reject only the property damage portion. You may also reject the Underinsured Motorist Coverage. The statute permits you to purchase Uninsured Motorist Coverage and/or Underinsured Motorist Coverage in an amount below the liability limits equal to the minimum Financial Responsibility limits.

Uninsured Motorist and Underinsured Motorist Coverages provide insurance for the protection of persons insured under the policy who are legally entitled to recover damages from owners or operators of uninsured/underinsured motor vehicles because of bodily injury, sickness or disease, including death, and for the protection of persons insured under the policy who are legally entitled to recover damages from identifiable owners or operators of uninsured/underinsured motor vehicles for injury to or destruction of property resulting therefrom.
